Rural Schools

CFA supports two nursery schools and one primary school, all of which are run by Pastor Moses of Word of Grace Church. Each school uses a Christian curriculum to reach out to communities that may not otherwise offer schooling. These three schools offer education to over 550 students each year, which is capped only due to funding. The village chiefs have expressed appreciation that their communities are getting a good education and the children are gaining knowledge and nourishment from the education and meals that these schools provide. Thanks to the support of our donors, CFA was able to finance the building of a new school and well at the beginning of 2019. The community is so blessed and thankful.

Ongoing Financial Needs:

- Salaries and one meal a day for the children
 - **\$12,000** per school year.
- Training for the teachers
 - **\$2500** for 2 sessions
- Money set aside for building maintenance

Prison Fellowship Malawi

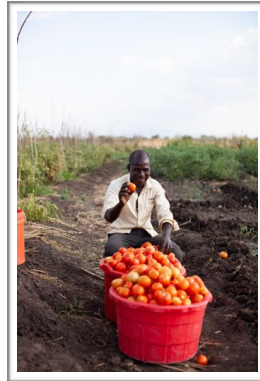
Children of Prisoners Program

There are many expenses in the administration of this new program for **Prison Fellowship Malawi**. Supplying families with clothing and food where needed, helping with house repair, the cost of gas and vehicle maintenance during the many required visits, to name a few. Irrigation Project

In 2012, Pastor Moses had a dream to create an irrigated garden for a rural community in Malawi. Seven years later, that dream has become a reality!

The garden is currently being used by 40 families and continues to grow. The families involved receive agricultural education and a food plot to care for where they can grow food to eat or sell. This garden project has been a blessing as it provides families with an income as well as training and nutritious food.

Please pray for the families involved and for the leaders as they continue to grow and manage this project!

Current financial needs:

- Hiring guards to watch over the gardens and equipment
 - **\$1200** for 3 guards for 12 Months
- Assistance with fertilizer and pesticides
 - **\$4000** per growing season. As the garden becomes successful this will be eliminated.

Child Evangelism Fellowship

Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) is a Bible-centered organization composed of born-again believers whose purpose is to evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and to disciple them in the Word of God and in a local church for Christian living. CFA has partnered with CEF leaders in Malawi and Burundi to provide ministry training to local churches and offer programs for children. Good News Clubs have been formed in various communities, which are led by trained leaders who are now reaching the children. We have seen a tremendous amount of growth in this program. Village Savings and Loan Program

These programs for village women provide goats, doves or chickens that the women raise, breed, and then sell. The first offspring is put back into the program, paying off their "loan." The money the women receive for the sale of meat, milk, and livestock provides them with a small amount of income to feed their families, make home improvements, and pay government school fees. Oftentimes these loans go to women who are widows or otherwise have no family to help support them.
